The purpose of this affidavit is to confirm to We The People that I am lawfully in office as representative of We The People in  
the 119<sup>th</sup> Congress of the United States of America.

1. I, affiant, understand and affirm that my Oath of Office is a requirement under Article VI, clause 3 of the Constitution  
of the United States, and is my pledge to, and sacred contract with, We The People of the United States of America,  
and I specifically affirm that I am not compromised in any manner that would affect the performance of my duties and  
Oath of Office.
2. I, affiant, as prescribed in 2 USC §25, have taken and maintained the following Oath of Office as found in 5 USC §3331:  
"I, **Robert Garcia**, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States  
against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; that I take this  
obligation freely, without any mental reservation or purpose of evasion; and that I will well and faithfully discharge the  
duties of the office on which I am about to enter. So help me God."
3. I, affiant, as prescribed in 2 USC §25, personally signed both printed copies of my written Oath of Office and delivered  
them to the Clerk for filing in the records of the House of Representatives, and to be recorded in the Journal of the  
House and in the Congressional Record, and have met all the criteria required to be lawfully in office.
4. I, affiant, in demonstration of good faith to We The People, and to remove any vagueness, confusion or doubt as to  
what I meant by using the word "discharge" in my Oath of Office, I hereby define and declare "discharge" to mean  
"accept and fulfill" in my Oath of Office.

I affirm that these facts are based on my personal knowledge, observation, or information that I believe to be reliable.
